



# REQUEST FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST FOR PROVISION OF CONSULTANCY SERVICES TO DEVELOP AN OIL SPILL CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR DEVELOPMENT DRILLING PHASE OF THE TILENGA PROJECT IN UGANDA

TOTAL E&P UGANDA (COMPANY) in its capacity as Operator of Contract Area (CA) 1 and License Area (LA) 2 invites experienced and reputable companies to assist in the further development of oil spill preparedness and response arrangements required for the next phase of activities. Service Providers/Contractors are requested to express interest in provision of consultancy services to develop an Oil Spill Contingency Plan (OSCP) for drilling phase development of the Tilenga project. The OSCP shall be developed in accordance with the applicable requirements of the National Oil Spill Contingency Plan (NOSCP), National Spill Prevention Regulations 2020, Good International Industry Practice (GIIP) internal regulations and Total rules.

### General Field Development Description

The Tilenga (PROJECT) is located in the North-East area of Lake Albert in Uganda and covers the fields in CA-1 block and the Northern part of LA-2 block. The overall objective is to provide specialist knowledge, experience and expertise to develop a fully operational OSCP in advance of the drilling phase development planned for mid-2022.

The description of services required for provision of OSCP Consultancy Services and Supply of equipment include: -

1. Perform a review (and update as required) of existing OSCP studies, NOSCP and regulations
2. Review the TOTAL E&P Uganda current Oil Spill Prevention and Response equipment inventory
3. Undertake site survey of existing and proposed locations for OSCP equipment/ and propose recommendations
4. Conduct an assessment of the overall preparedness of oil spill preparedness and contingency planning resources and propose further recommendations
5. Develop the comprehensive Oil Spill Contingency Plan for development drilling development
  - a. Identification of organizational arrangements and resources
  - b. Development of competency/training criteria
  - c. Development of revised OSCP equipment inventory for drilling development
  - d. Procurement and supply of Oil Spill Prevention and Response equipment
6. Provide guidance and specialist support to the company for operationalization of the OSCP including facilitation of drills exercises to thoroughly test the OSCP
7. Provide initial training for company and contractor personnel

### The Consultant shall focus on;

- Review of applicable documentation (OSCP studies, Emergency Response Plans, NOSCP, national regulations and international guidelines)
- Well pad design, drilling programs/schedules, logistics and waste management arrangements
- Previous project studies related to Oil spill for Tilenga (Spill modelling, Oil Weathering, Oil Chemistry, Sensitivity Mapping & Environment Risk Assessments, etc)
- Previous project studies related to Environment and Social Impacts (ESIAs) of the project
- Review the National, International Regulations for Oil Spill and international best practices
- All COMPANY OSCPs, related documentation and Emergency Response system

### Statements of EOI should be no more than ten (10) pages long and should include the following:

- Proposed scope, level of effort and duration
- Description of deliverables
- Qualification of managers and key personnel who would be providing the service
- Summary of related experience and expertise with similar work and selected references.
- Proposed partnerships if relevant
- Cost estimates are not to be included in the EOI.

Contractors must be qualified to conduct the work as outlined above and should demonstrate previous experience in the effective delivery of similar services.

### Tender Process

The CFT package will be issued via COMPANY's "ARIBA" e-sourcing system to Tenderer's advised email contact. The e-sourcing platform shall be the means of communication between COMPANY and all Tenderers in relation to this CFT. Please note in particular the requirements to: (i) accept COMPANY's confidentiality undertaking on the e-sourcing platform as a pre-requisite to access the Tender documents (ii) submission of Acknowledgement to participate to Tender within advised time in the Tender Documents. Your Tender must be submitted not later than the date and time (Closing Date) specified on the e-sourcing platform.

### Log-in Guidelines to E-sourcing Platform

In order to participate in the CFT process, Tenderer must first log onto the e-sourcing platform using the link that Tenderer shall receive at Tenderer's advised email contact.

- If Tenderer has previously used COMPANY's e-sourcing tool, Tenderer shall select 'sign up' and use known password. There is an option to setup a new password in the event the password is forgotten by clicking on forgot password below sign-in field.
- If Tenderer has never used COMPANY's e-sourcing tool, Tenderer shall select 'sign-up' and register its entity on the platform. ### Minimum requirements to participate in the Prequalification Process:

- At least Ten years' experience providing similar services within Uganda, East African region and/ or internationally.
- Suitably qualified and experienced personnel.
- Demonstrated operational capacity to provide services defined above;
- EOIs from suitable partnerships and consortiums/ventures for the provision of the required services are encouraged. Preference shall be given to suitably qualified in-country registered entities demonstrating commitment to statutory National Content requirements for oil and gas operations;
- Financial capacity to deliver the services required;
- Current registration to; or application to be registered to; the National Supplier Database for the year 2021;
- Possess appropriate licensing from relevant in-country Authorities for the provision of the above defined services.
